For each reading due date, complete all three elements of the assignment explained below. Each assignment is worth 70 points; thus, your entire analysis of *Emma* is worth 280 points.

- Jane Austen wrote about Emma, "I am going to a take a heroine whom no one but myself will much like." She is certainly a complex character, one whose strengths may be equaled or outnumbered by her flaws. As you read, focus on the ways in which Austen reveals Emma's complex character by choosing <u>four</u> quotations of direct or <u>indirect characterization</u>. In a detailed paragraph for each, explain how the quotation illuminates Emma's character. (10 points each; 40 points total)
- 2. Choose **one** quotation that illustrates the use of a particular literary device. In a detailed paragraph, discuss the effect of the use of the literary device on meaning. (10 points)
- 3. During your reading, identify **four** words that are unfamiliar to you and that you would like to incorporate into you own vocabulary. Write the sentence from the book with the word in it and indicate page number in a parenthetical citation. Record the definition(s) of the word. If multiple definitions exist, choose the definition(s) that fits the context of the book's sentence. Create a sentence of your own using the new word in proper context. (5 points each; 20 points total)
