

# **Integrating Quotations into Writing**

When you analyze, explain, or cite ideas from a passage to support your interpretation, you need to integrate the quotations smoothly into your own sentences. This is also called embedding quotations or incorporating quotations.

### **poorly integrated quotation**

The phrase, “the gloom hovering over them,” shows the ominous feeling of the scene.

### **effectively integrated quotation**

The scene with “the gloom hovering over them” is eerie and dismal and creates an ominous feeling about the characters’ fate.

If you change the form of a word when you quote, you must enclose that word in brackets to show your reader what you did.

As the “gloom [hovers] over them,” the reader feels a sense of ominous unrest.
