4. Where and why does the symbol of the locked appear?
5. Discuss another example of something that is locked or sealed against Mr. Utterson.

Answer each question about “The Incident at the Window,” using at least one quotation for support of each.

1. Discuss ways in which the weather reflects characters’ emotions in this chapter.
2. How does Stephenson hint that the expression on Dr. Jekyll’s face terrifies Utterson and Enfield? What is the significance of this situation?
3. What similarities can you find between the men’s reaction to this incident and their reaction to Mr. Hyde?
4. Why does Utterson mutter “God forgive us” after the incident at the window?
