## Twelve Olympian Flashcards:

- Working in pairs, create 3 flashcards (on brown cards) for each of the twelve gods.
  - (1) Greek name on one side; Roman name on other.
  - (2) Greek/Roman names on one side; the god's jobs and roles on the other.
  - (3) Greek/Roman names on one side; the god's symbols, sacred animals/plants, significant objects on other.
