English 12: British Literature and Composition Motif Journal and PowerPoint Project for *Othello*

Task:

Track one <u>motif</u> through the course of the play. You will document your work through a journal and *discuss* the play creatively through a PowerPoint presentation. You may work with a partner if you choose.

Motifs:

- 1. battle, war, fighting, military
- 2. black, white, darkness, light
- 3. demons, devils, monsters, hideousness
- 4. civilization, savagery
- 5. honesty, dishonesty, deception, spying
- 6. money, value, theft
- 7. naturalness, unnaturalness
- 8. purity, immorality, adultery, reputation, honor
- 9. webs, entrapment, entanglement
- 10. witchcraft, magic

Motif journal elements:

Record a minimum of twenty quotations (if working in a pair) or ten quotations (if working alone) that reveal the motif. For each quotation, include the following information:

- exact quotation and correct citation (act.scene.line[s])
- identification of speaker and context of quotation
- explanation of meaning and significance of quotation

PowerPoint elements:

- a theme statement: What idea about human nature does the motif develop throughout the play?
- six supporting quotations (using proper citation and identifying the speaker) from various acts of the play (at least one quotation from each act)
- detailed paragraph-length explanations for each of the quotations you have chosen and how each relates to and supports your thesis
- a creative visual or visuals appropriate to your thesis and quotations
