Seeing in Believing

Communicating Beliefs through Stories, Images, Words

Instructions

- Belief is more than just saying what you think.
 It's about acting in a way that supports the belief.
- After selecting a belief statement, work with your partner to communicate that belief through stories, images, and words.
- Create a large poster that will
- help other people understand what this belief means through your eyes

Elements you might include:

- 1. Synonyms (words and phrases that mean the same thing as the belief statement) OR words/phrases associated with this concept;
- 2. Pictures/images of belief in action—pictures may be narrative or metaphoric;
- 3. Stories that show what belief means;
- 4. Clearing up misconceptions about this belief;
- 5. Rules that govern this belief;
- 6. Top Five list.

Examples of #4 for Life is Fair.

- Even-Steven
- You get out of it as much as you put into it.
- You get what you deserve.

Examples of #5 for Learning from Your Mistakes.

- 1. You need to know when you've made a mistake.
- 2. You need to stifle all defensive impulses.

Examples of #6: Top Five Daily Miracles.

- 5. I get up every day.
- 4. Math II is first period so by the time I wake up it's over.
- 3. There's such a thing as Fruit Loops.
