### **Transcripts!**

Thank you for your patience with requesting transcripts. As I said when I visited classes last week, it will now take 48 hours for us to process any transcript requests. The procedure for requesting transcripts remains the same. Fill out the request form in Mrs. Tucker's office and leave it in the burgundy tray. Mrs. Tucker will process the request within 48 hours. You will need to pick it up and mail it yourself. Please allow enough time for you to meet your deadlines!

New transcripts do not have SAT or ACT scores on them. You will need to contact <u>www.collegeboard.com</u> or <u>www.act.org</u> to have your scores sent to colleges.

If you have been admitted to college already, please bring a copy of your admissions letter and pick up a pendant from Mrs. Tucker. Decorate your pendant and we will hang it from the ceiling in the hallway outside the counseling office.

### **College Admissions**

You haven't applied yet! Get going! Many colleges have late admissions deadlines so there is still time to apply!

### This month you should:

- Apply! Apply! Apply!
- Ask someone to proofread your application.

- Try to send in your college applications by February break. Be sure to photo copy and keep all application materials just in case they get lost.
- Send SAT/ACT test scores directly to your colleges. Our new transcripts do not have SAT or ACT test scores on them. Contact collegeboard.com or act.org for more information.
- Monitor your application deadlines. Make sure all of the required information is sent in by the deadline!

### Young Men must register with the Selective Service.

Young men between the ages of 18 and 25 must register for the Selective Service. You should register within 30 days of your 18<sup>th</sup> birthday.

"What happens if you don't register? Not registering is a felony! Young men convicted of failure to register may be fined up to \$250,000, imprisoned for up to five years or both. Failure to register may also cause you to permanently forfeit eligibility for certain benefits such as student financial aid, government employment, employment with the Postal Service, job training, and US citizenship for male immigrants." (taken from the selective service pamphlet)

Registration is easy. You can register at the post office or through the internet at http://www.sss.gov

#### **BYU Classes**

It is your responsibility to make sure that you make up failed classes in time for graduation. I must have an official transcript/grade report from BYU by May 1, 2009.
