Include a persuasive paragraph encouraging travelers to take your trip.

Why should travelers take your trip instead of any other? What makes it special? Use specific rhetorical devices (personal anecdotes, appeals to emotion, logic, or ethics, etc.) to convince your reader that *this* is the trip to take.

On the back of your brochure (where the rubric is located on this example), include a map of your journey with each stop clearly marked. You may print a PLAIN map from the internet, but you should indicate the stops on the trip yourself. Also, please be sure to cite your source.

 Be sure to address the importance of the location in *The Odyssey*!
- Include an illustration (a picture of a creature, notable sites, etc.). Illustrations should be colorful and should have a clear connection to the location. At least TWO of your illustrations should be handdrawn.



EXAMPLE:

(This is not one of the locations on your list!)

Scheria

"... he is to reach fertile Scheria, the land of the Phaeacians, who are near of kin to the gods..." (5.35-37).

The beautiful island city of Scheria is home to the Phaeacians, a noble race who are famed for their fast ships. The Pheaecian king Alcinous aided Odysseus by providing a trip back to Ithaca in one of these famed ships. While in Scheria, our travelers will enjoy a visit with Nausicaa, the king's lovely daughter, and a day cruise aboard one of the Phaeacian ships.
