Part I: Instructions

- Compose eight sentences using your vocabulary words and following the model from last week's *Discovering Voice* sample: "Kate could see her <u>rummaging</u> through the cabin, <u>dumping</u> drawers, and <u>knocking</u> things from the shelves of cabinets." With each sentence, you need to use *vivid* word choice and a series of three elements to describe an intense situation.
- For the word wistful, you might write this sentence:
 "Already reading at a ninth-grade level, Sally was bored in class; therefore, she wistfully stared out of the window of her second-grade classroom, dreamily fantasized about beginning college at age ten, and arduously endeavored to ignore her philistine classmates."

Part II: Instructions

- Compose eight sentences using your vocabulary words and following the model from last week's Discovering Voice sample: "I have a dream that one day even the state of Mississippi, a desert state sweltering with the heat of injustice and oppression, will be transformed into an oasis of freedom and justice." With each sentence, you need to use a form of figurative language (metaphor, simile, personification, allusion) to convey an idea.
- For the word progeny, you might write this sentence: "His progeny were as plentiful as the ark inhabitants; they marched two by two to the dining room in what seemed an interminable line."
